

Chickens and rabbits project

Context analysis and objectives:

The school is a mixed day public school; it is localized in Murang'a county, Central Region, at 70 Km from Nairobi, along the Thika – Nyeri highway.

Background info: the school has about 600 pupils from nursery to class 8 and 19 teachers; they tried simple agriculture projects, but they had problems with crops because of difficulties with water supply. Then they have an existing chicken project where parents contributed materials to put up a simple shed, others brought the initial chickens. It seems this can work well and so they would wish to put up a proper hutch and add more chicken and rabbits.

So project's aims are:

- creating favourable conditions for international and local cooperation
- animals farming
- training students on keeping animals, self management and doing reports
- using earnings of animals farming to save money for the school's needs, students in need and to self sustain the project in future
- employing a person in need

- 1. Sharing about the importance of training youngs on keeping animals, self management, fund raising and materials, animals raising among people and associations (taking part as school to local shows and exhibitions to popularize the school project).

- 4. Selling eggs and animals
- 5. Doing reports about the activities
